She hangs up when they arrive at the Emergency Room.

The RA is your only source of information. Your child is not answering her cell anymore and every time you call the hospital, they tell you your 'child' is an adult and they don't have permission to share anything with you because it is a HIPAA violation. Unless you can prove otherwise, the hospital is not going to tell you anything about your daughter.

For our families with children over the age of 18, it is important to remember that *they are legal adults*. This translates to parents not being able to make financial or medical decisions without a:

- ✓ **Medical Power of Attorney**
- ✓ **Financial Power of Attorney**
- ✓ **Living Will**
- ✓ **HIPAA Release**
